REPORTS TO REVIEW	Community Outreach Ideas & Successes
DISCUSSION	<p>Student Council held a "Trunk or Treat" event for the community. It was very successful and a great way to involve the community. Saturday events (middle school basketball tournaments) great way to use our facilities to get other schools/students to look at Santa Rita for high school.</p> <p>Continue to open and offer our campus facilities to charter schools and middle schools.</p> <p>Saguaro spends a lot more time at La Paloma trying to recruit Need to step up our efforts. The Saguaro newsletter goes out to La Paloma students and families. Ways to get more students to come to our school. Target private schools to recruit students.</p>

	<p>Have Santa Rita students go to other middle schools and talk about the programs that we offer here. Dental, Diesel, CTE etc. Example would be Dietz</p> <p>Ms. Lundt suggested that we reintroduce the graduation walk at middle schools. SR Graduates go to middle schools with their graduation regalia to inspire students to come to SR.</p> <p>Create fliers promoting SRHS and put them up in middle schools.</p> <p>Future Eagle Night is January 21st – families can go to the basketball game for free.</p> <p>Sonoran Science Academy – who is looking into recruitment?</p> <p>More eventful partnership with Pima Community College??? Advice is to have several events throughout the year even if they are smaller.</p> <p>Idea for a WIN club that could go to other schools to recruit. Ms. Lundt stated that NHS and AVID students just went into the middle schools to promote SRHS.</p> <p>Outreach to the students on base? Non-existent at this point. How do we recruit students from this area?</p> <p>How do we get counselors, registrars etc. from other middle schools to start discussing Santa Rita as a great option for high school.</p> <p>Open enrollment – access to 8th grade parents.</p> <p>Enrollment video – Media Day – December 13th Ms. Ray has been asking for district level support in promoting SRHS. Media Day is viewed as an opportunity and a launching/recruitment opportunity for SRHS.</p> <p>Many students come from other areas and districts to attend the dental program but do not attend SR they just come for the dental class. (Alternative viewpoint, students should not be allowed to just pick and choose what class they want to attend and SR and what classes they do not want to take.</p> <p>Great opportunity for an AGECE – great partnership with PCC</p> <p>Lower enrollment = lower FTE = District support is essential for SRHS growth</p> <p>B rating is another reason to promote and grow SRHS. Ideas for a “spring fling” event on campus.</p> <p>Increased interest in alumni support of SRHS.</p>
