

## School Letter Grade

The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) assigns each school a letter grade based on spring 2025 ACT and ACT Aspire results. When the information is received, we will notify our community. Preliminary results shared by ADE indicate we will remain a "B" school.

#### School letter grades are based on:

- The percentage of students who are proficient on the ACT and ACT Aspire assessments given each Spring in the areas of ELA, Writing, and Math
- The percentage of students who attained academic growth reaching or exceeding grade level expectations as determined by student performance statewide
- Additional factors such as the percentage of students evaluated, College and Career Readiness indicators, graduation rate, and reclassification of English language students.

**Title** I funds help our school maintain / improve our school score by improving student achievement through the strategic use of federal funds.

### Integrated Action Plan (IAP)

Our school leadership team composed of staff and families completed a needs assessment in the spring. We addressed student needs and allocated Title I resources to support:

- 1. Well trained staff using effective teaching practices
- Interventions for struggling students
- 3. Families to help students achieve in school

To ensure that all students receive a high-quality education, we employ appropriately certified staff, who use research based instructional methods. Our school plan includes addressing the learning goals for both Math and ELA.

# Integrated Action Plan (IAP)



To support struggling learners with additional resources and help in reading and mathematics, our school plan to improve reading achievement includes the following:

- a. Reading/Math Interventions55-minutes per week during WIN time (Wed)
- Additional Reading/Math Classes (3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter)
   50-minutes of additional Targeted Learning
   Support (TLS)
- c. Reading/Math Tutors
  - Tutoring will be held afterschool (Monday & Friday) and during extended lunch days by appointment.

#### You must be informed within 4 weeks if:


 Your child is being taught by a teacher who does not meet the appropriately certified requirements of the state
